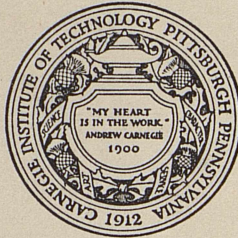

It should be of interest to the friends of the Carnegie Institute of Technology to know that the Carnegie Corporation, of New York, will pay to the Trustees of the Institute of Technology on July 1, 1946, eight million dollars provided we secure the sum of four million dollars. In other words, for every dollar that is subscribed, we shall receive an additional two dollars from the Corporation. One-third of this amount may be in buildings; the other two-thirds must be applied to endowment.
