HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENTS

HAROLD EDGAR CLURMAN, theater critic, director, and author, will receive the honorary degree of Doctor of Fine Arts and will deliver the commencement address. He received his education at Columbia University and the University of Paris at Sorbonne. He is currently theater critic of *The Nation*. Actor, stage manager, and play reader from 1924 to 1931, he became co-founder of the Group Theatre in 1931 and remained with that organization until 1941. From 1941 to 1944, he was a producer-director in Hollywood. In 1946 he became critic of the arts for *Tomorrow Magazine* and in 1949 he also became theater critic for the *New Republic*. In 1953, he left both those positions to join *The Nation*. In 1959, he was guest critic for the *London Observer*. He has written three books.

Mr. Clurman has received the French Legion of Honor, The George Jean Nathan Award for Dramatic Criticism, and an honorary degree from Bard College. During the past year, he was Visiting Andrew Mellon Professor of Drama at Carnegie Institute of Technology. He has directed both in England and the U. S. A. Among the plays: "A Member of the Wedding," "Heartbreak House," "Desire Under the Elms," "Awake and Sing," "Bus Stop," "Time of the Cuckoo," "Orpheus Descending," "Tiger at the Gates," "Touch of a Poet," "A Shot in the Dark," "The Autumn Garden," and "Judith."

CALVIN EDWARD GROSS, superintendent of schools, New York City, will receive the honorary degree of Doctor of Humane Letters. Prior to accepting his New York appointment, Mr. Gross was superintendent of Pittsburgh Schools from 1958 to 1963. He received his A.B. from the University of California at Los Angeles in 1940, his M.S. from the University of Southern California in 1947, and his Ed.D. from Harvard University in 1955. During World War II, he served with the U. S. Army anti-aircraft artillery and also developed research programs for Army University Centers in France and England. After the war, Mr. Gross was a teacher and administrator in the Los Angeles public schools. In 1950, he was one of five Education Fellows chosen by Harvard University through national competition. From 1951 to 1956, he was superintendent of schools, Weston, Massachusetts; from 1956 to 1958, he was superintendent of schools, Niskayuna Central School District, Schenectady, New York.

In Pittsburgh, Mr. Gross was a member of the citizens' sponsoring committee of the Allegheny Conference on Community Development, director of WQED educational television, and executive board member of the Urban League of Pittsburgh, Inc., in addition to participating in other civic and cultural activities.

ROY ARTHUR HUNT, former chairman of the executive committee, Aluminum Company of America, will receive the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws. He received his A.B. from Yale University in 1903 and then began his life-long career with the company which his father, Captain Alfred E. Hunt, founded in 1888 as the Pittsburgh Reduction Company and which was later named Alcoa. In 1928, Mr. Roy Hunt was elected president of Alcoa and held that post for 23 years until he was elected chairman of the executive committee in 1951. He is a director of the Mellon National Bank and Trust Company, National Union Fire Insurance Company, and the Pittsburgh Testing Laboratory. He is a trustee of Carnegie Institute, Carnegie Institute of Technology, Shadyside Academy, Grove City College, Elizabeth Steel Magee Hospital, and Pittsburgh Skin and Cancer Foundation.

In 1943, Mr. Hunt received the American Society for Metals medal for advancement of research; in 1944, an honorary degree from the University of Pittsburgh;

and in 1953, an honorary degree from Oberlin College.

On October 29, 1958, Carnegie Institute of Technology announced a gift of \$2,800,000 from Mr. and Mrs. Hunt for construction of a new campus library, which now stands at the head of the campus mall—to the right of today's commencement ceremonies.

FREDERICK SEITZ, president of the National Academy of Sciences, will receive the honorary degree of Doctor of Science. Mr. Seitz received his A.B. in mathematics from Stanford University in 1932 and his Ph.D. in physics from Princeton University in 1934. Successively, he has been instructor, then assistant professor in physics, University of Rochester; research physicist, General Electric Company; assistant, then associate professor of physics, University of Pennsylvania; professor and chairman of the physics department, Carnegie Institute of Technology (1942-49). Since 1949, he has been research professor of physics, University of Illinois, and since 1957, he has been head of the physics department at Illinois. His major professional interest has been in the theory of solids and nuclear physics.

Mr. Seitz is a member of the Defense Science Board; the Naval Research Advisory Committee (chairman, 1960-62); the Policy Advisory Board, Argonne National Laboratory; the Statuatory Visiting Committee for the National Bureau of Standards; and consultant to the Air Force Office of Scientific Research. He has previously held such positions as director of the training program in atomic energy, Oak Ridge National Laboratory; consultant to the Secretary of War; science advisor to the North Atlantic Treaty Organization; and civilian member of the National Defense Research Committee.
