BIOGRAPHY OF WENDY GRAMM

DR. WENDY LEE GRAMM, 39, of College Station, was born in Hawaii.

Attending college on academic scholarships, she earned B.A. and Ph. D. degrees in Economics from Wellesley College and Northwestern University. Prior to resigning her position to campaign for her husband, Congressman Phil Gramm, Wendy was Director of the Bureau of Economics of the Federal Trade Commission.

Wendy Gramm joined the faculty at Texas A&M University in 1970 and was named Director of Undergraduate Programs in the Economics Department in 1974. At Texas A&M, Wendy had a distinguished academic career, publishing numerous scholarly articles in economic journals worldwide. Her research on working women and the impact of marriage and children on the decision of women to participate in the labor force helped lay the groundwork for current economic research on the family.

After leaving Texas A&M to go to Washington with her husband following his election to Congress, Wendy joined the Institute for Defense Analyses as an economic analyst. In 1982, she accepted the position of Assistant Director for Consumer Protection in the Federal Trade Commission's Bureau of Economics. Dr. Gramm subsequently was promoted to Director of the Bureau of Economics, one of the three divisions of the Federal Trade Commission.

Wendy and Phil Gramm have two sons, Marshall, 11, and Jeff, 9. The Gramms are Episcopalians.
